headline- 2nd Annual Run to Read benefiting Jean Dean RIF - a huge success!

"The 2nd Annual Run to Read benefiting Jean Dean Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) was a huge success at every level! Thanks to our very capable Run Director, Rich Bailey, and his dedicated Run Committee, four times as many participants registered this year," reports Cathy Gafford, Director, Jean Dean RIF. *"It was a beautiful day where over 200 people, runners, walkers and volunteers, came together to help at-risk young children across Alabama get books in their homes.*

At the event, individuals and families from several counties stood together and enjoyed seeing a perfectly done flag ceremony conducted by the 113 Auburn Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol while Garret Miles delivered a stirring rendition of the Star Spangled Banner. Mayor of Opelika Gary Fuller declared October 3, 2009 "Run to Read Day" and reminded the crowd of the importance of literacy efforts. Bailey also read a letter from Governor Bob Riley reinforcing that need. The crowd enjoyed Clifford the Big Red Dog and Aubie and the AU Women Gymnasts were valuable assets to the event. The Kicker broadcast from the Run and gave folks a chance to talk about why they supported this literacy effort. AU Spirit Points were awarded for registering. Walkers walked and runners ran. Folks got great door prizes and goody bags, which were supported by local businesses. One lucky winner, Trey Butler, got a week's vacation in the North Carolina Mountains! *"Happy winners got their medals and a good time was had by all,"* according to Run Director Bailey.

He summarized the event; *"David Wishart was the first runner back, in just 15 minutes, 17.3 seconds. The total 5K race took 47 minutes, 9.6 seconds. The 90 5K participants ranged in age from one to 59. The one and 3 year old registered were piloted by their fathers and at least one dog also ran the race! It was exciting to see! Another 75 participated in the walk to help support early literacy in Alabama. Including volunteers, over 200 folks were on hand for the 2nd Annual RUN to Read. (Another 30 or so registered but didn't make it to the event, but their registrations are very much appreciated!). Benteler Automotive employees won the participation trophy with over 30 employees and their families participating!"*
